

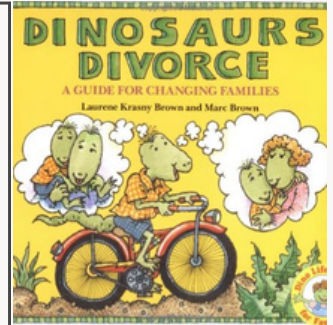

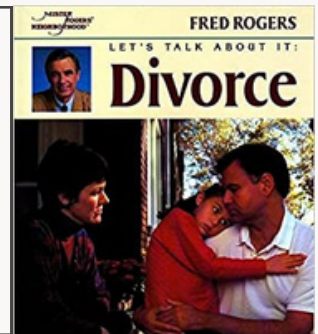

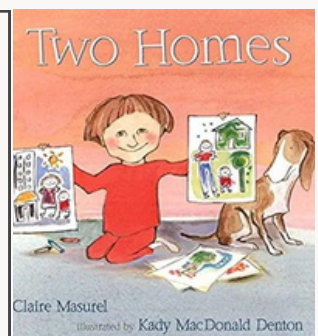

TWO HOMES

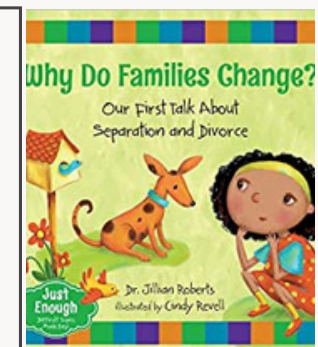

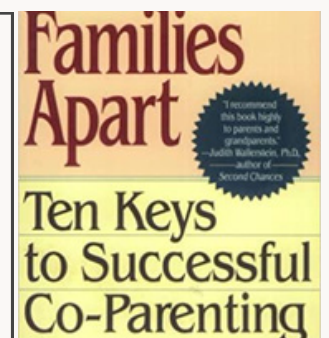
MOM'S HOUSE, DAD'S HOUSE: MAKING TWO HOMES FOR YOUR CHILD

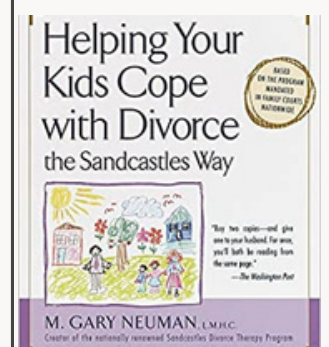
FAMILIES APART
